

## NOTICE TO MARINERS No 46 (T) of 2024

Port of Southampton - Dredging - March 2024

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the trailing suction hopper dredger UKD BLUEFIN will be engaged in dredging operations in the main channels, swinging grounds and berths in the Rivers Itchen and Test, Port of Southampton, Southampton Water, as well as the Thorn Channel for a period of up to 15 days commencing on or around 10<sup>th</sup> March 2024

Bed levelling will also be carried out by the bed levelling tender UKD SEALION in berths and channels as necessary in conjunction with the dredging program. This work will commence on 11<sup>th</sup> March 2024 10 days.





Bed levelling will commence at Esso – Fawley Marine Terminal on 11<sup>th</sup> March 2024 for a period of approx. 10 days in conjunction with the ABP maintenance works.

Dredging and bed levelling will continue in the western docks by GPS avenger and additionally by the Norma 2 once she arrives in port this NTM will be amended.

The dredgers and tender will display lights and shapes as required by the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea and mariners are requested to reduce speed as safe navigation permits when passing them whilst engaged in underwater activities.



Weather allowing, these operations will be continuous throughout the stated period and mariners should expect to pass UKD BLUEFIN at any time between the upper reaches of Southampton Water and the Nab Disposal Ground.

The dredgers will maintain a listening watch on VHF Channel 12 throughout dredging operations and mariners may also request movement information from Southampton VTS on VHF Channel

12.
